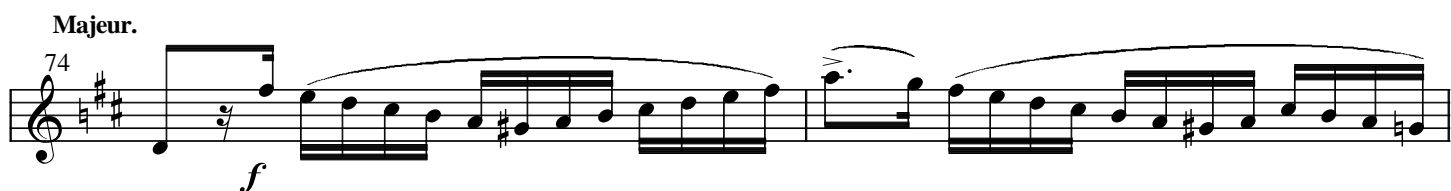
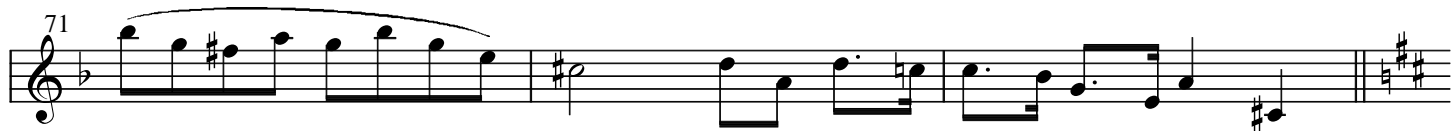
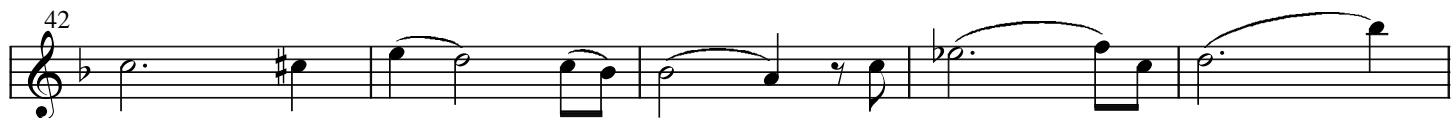


# Sonate No. 2 in D Minor

**Allegretto.**

Oboe

**Sonate No. 2: 1st Movement:** Brod presents a most-exciting first movement in his second sonata. He has given a meter of 2/2 in Allegretto, but 4/4 seems more appropriate, albeit with a metronome marking of 132 to the quarter in order to get the movement off the ground. The structure reveals that he was following a procedure for sonata form we now associate with Domenico Scarlatti, insofar as the contrasting themes all are of the closing variety:

Exposition:

- Theme 1 in i
- Theme 1k1 in III
- Theme 1k2 in III
- Theme 1k3 in III

Development:

- Theme 1 fragment : III to V of I

Recapitulation

- Theme 1 in i
- Theme 1k1 in I
- Theme 1k2 in I
- Theme 1k4 in i
